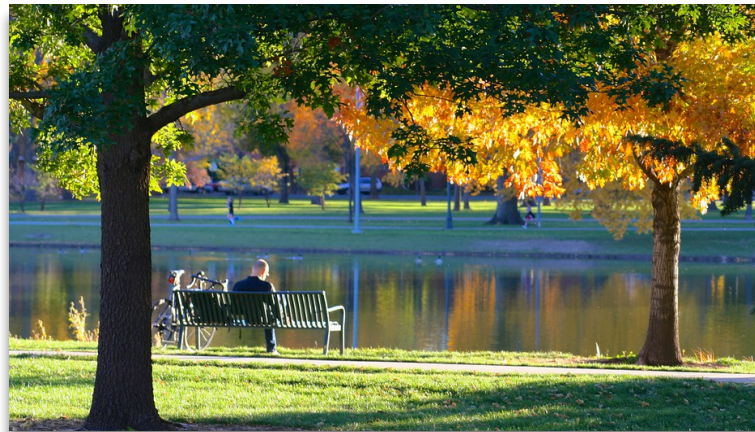


City Park

City Park was already well underway by the time the City Beautiful movement of 1893 was implemented. Designed to mimic New York's Central Park, it became so expansive the entire residential neighborhood would wind up being only two blocks wide and running only one mile long making it a low-residency area. Well kept properties and beautiful tree-lined streets, stately Denver squares, Queen Anne, Victorians and bungalows and some high rise apartments are attractive, however, the ease of walking to local shops, restaurants and entertainment on historic Colfax Ave's in the Bluebird District is a big draw for most residents. Denver's City Park neighborhood sits next to Denver's premier cultural amenities including the Denver Zoo, and the Museum of Nature and Science, and a quick jaunt to downtown Denver. This historic area is named for the expansive, 320-acre park that provides the "postcard view" of Denver's skyline against a mountain backdrop. Biking, boating, tennis and golf, City Park is also home to the Denver Zoo, Denver Museum of Nature and Science, two lakes, a boathouse and City Park Golf Course. Some families have lived here for generations, and the area's varied architecture reflects its rich history.



Located in the City and County of Denver, the City Park neighborhood is bounded by York Street, Colorado Boulevard, East 23rd Avenue, and East Colfax Avenue.
